

DECEMBER 20, 2021

The Keota City Council met on December 20, 2021 at the Keota City Hall. The work session was called to order at 6:13 p.m. by Mayor Anthony Cansler.

Council Members answering roll call were: Mike Bender, Keith Conrad, Rod Hill, and Heath McDonald. Matt Greiner was unable to attend. City employee present was Tomisha Hammes. Also in attendance was Patrick Eagen, Katie McDonald, Kathy Davis, Nick Beinhart, Karen Sypherd, Danielle Imhoff, Brandon Imhoff, Linda Werger, Robyn Morgan and Dan Flynn.

Discussion was held with One Design and Engineering in regards to the Keota Municipal Pool Project. The Pool Advocates met with One Design and Engineering at 5:00 p.m. prior to the work session to discuss and go over the pool plan updates from the original plans that were presented in November. The clerk requested a budgetary cost estimates be given for the operating expenses and number of lifeguards by January 4, 2022 to include in the fiscal year 2023 budget. The Council requested that the clerk send the design plans to Amy Schulte at the YMCA to get her recommendation on the number of lifeguards needed to run the pool as well as input on the potential design plan.

Motion was made by Councilman Bender to adjourn work session at 6:57 p.m. Councilman Conrad seconded the motion. Motion passed with a 4-0 vote.

The Keota City Council meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Anthony Cansler.

Department Reports:

-Public Works Department – Written Report was submitted. Tremmel was in town to disconnect the water and sewer from 110 N. Iowa Street. The snow fence was put up last week and the ditch was cleaned out on the west end of Washington Avenue. The compost site has been busy the last couple of weeks with the nice weather. Hauling junk concrete and dirt out from the sewer plant. Storm drains will be cleared out later this week from all the corn stalks that blew into town.

-Police Department – No report submitted.

-Wilson Memorial Library – Written report submitted. The new website provided by the State went live last week. Thank you to Micah for coming to pick up the sticks and debris after the storm. Library Board meeting will take place next week. Danielle Imhoff said that she talked with the Washington Conservationist and he stated that he really enjoyed working with Keota on the StoryWalk because the residents are very involved with getting projects done at the KeWash Trailhead.

-Keota Historical Museum – Nothing to report at this time.

Motion was made by Councilman Conrad to approve the Roost liquor license. Councilman Bender seconded the motion. Motion passed with a 4-0 vote.

The agreement between the City of Keota and One Design and Engineering was reviewed. The document was reviewed by the City's attorney with a few recommendations. The clerk was asked to submit the recommendations from the City attorney to Patrick Eagen.

Keota Municipal Pool updates – Nick Beinhart stated that after the original plans were submitted back in November, the Pool Advocates met and gave their recommendations on what they would like to see different, changes to the pool house, and what could/couldn't be added to fit within the scope of the budget. He feels that Patrick is listening to what the Pool Advocates are requesting and working with them on getting the final plans done. Councilman Bender stated that he would like to see the City put some money towards the pool because it will help to enhance the park area. Councilman Conrad stated that the Council needs to be careful when looking at what to add as concession stand amenities. If the City isn't the one making money off the concession stand proceeds, then careful consideration needs to be made on what concession stand equipment the City is purchasing.

Citizen Comments: No comments.

Clerk/Council/Mayor Comments: The clerk stated that all City departments will be closed December 24, 27, 31 and January 3 for the holidays. The clerk attended the Iowa Rural Development Council

meeting in Oskaloosa on Wednesday, December 15. She was able to network with a lot of great resources for Keota. Councilman Bender stated that the fire department is in need of a generator for the station. Councilman Conrad stated that they would need to reach out to Larry Smith to see what grants would be available for them to apply for to get a new generator for their building. Councilman Bender went on to say that he would like to see the Council look into raising the wages of the Council and Mayor. People don't realize the number of calls and things that the Mayor and Council do outside of the regular meetings. He also stated that the Council needs to decide what to do with the old pool during budget season. Councilman Hill stated that he would like to see the Council move forward with working on the sidewalk improvements in town. He would also like to see a dog park put in somewhere. He stated that he has been on Council for 12 years. He is going to miss being a Councilman, but feels like the community has really come together to work on some great projects. He said thank you to the city employees and to the community for everything that you do for this town. Thank you also to the Council and the Mayor. He thanked the Mayor for standing up for the Council and doing what he believes is right. Mayor Cansler presented the Council with their yearly checks for attending Council meetings He then said thank you to the Council, employees and community members for all the hard work they do to make this community what it is.. Thanks were given to Councilman Hill for all the work and years of service he gave to the City of Keota. He ended with a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

Motion was made by Councilman Hill to adjourn at 7:58 p.m. Councilman Conrad seconded the motion. Motion passed with a 4-0 vote. The City Council will next meet on Wednesday, January 5, 2021, starting at 7:00 p.m.
