Department Reports:

- -Public Works Department –Snow fence has been put up. Tremmel Back Hoe Service should be in town this week to repair 2 fire hydrants and one main. Hoping the street sweeper will be out this week.
- -Police Department report was submitted for October 15 through October 31, 2022. There were twenty four complaints/service calls and four citations issued. Service Calls/Complaints: one burglary, one theft, one simple assault, one vandalism, one family and children, one OWI, one trespass, four assist and service, three attempt to locate, two civil disputes, one misc. complaint, one dog/cat misc. animal, two traffic violations, three domestic abuse. Citations issued: three Speed/Alternative Enforcement violations and one Criminal Mischief 5th Simple Mischief.

-Wilson Memorial Library – There was a large group turnout for Halloween. The uptown area was very busy with trick or treaters as well. Reported that Saturday November 5, 2022 a branch fell out of a tree on the library property causing damage to a car. Pictures were taken of the damage as well as the branch and Rita Sheetz will be contacted regarding the process that will need to be taken.

-Keota Historical Museum – They are asking the City to pay for paint for the basement. They were asked to get paint quotes and turn in.

New Business: Discussion with Paws and More: Present were Amber Talbot, 18 year Director and Sara O'Donnell, Treasurer. There was discussion on the potential of Paws and More building a new building after having been in the same place for 22 years. The volume of cats is a big issue. It takes two years to see the impact on the reduction of cats following a neutering plan. Impound would cost a lot of money. They would trap cats with the help of citizens at a cost of \$35-\$70/cat. They will keep a cat for one day after neutering. Dogs are not an issue. More discussion will follow.

Motion was made by Councilman Conrad to approve the Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Finance Report, Councilwoman Imhoff seconded the motion: Roll call vote: Ayes-Bender, Conrad, Imhoff, Greiner and McDonald. Nays- None. Motion was passed with a 5-0 vote.

First Reading of Ordinance Amendment 2022-297 Lawn Furniture was approved. Motion was made my Councilwoman Imhoff, Councilman Bender seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Ayes-Bender, Conrad, Imhoff, Greiner and McDonald. Nays-None.

Citizen Comments: Mike Detweiler inquired about his building permit and Councilman Conrad stated he would meet with him to discuss further.
